History of Genuine Mahogany. Mahogany is a type of wood that is simply described as having straight-grains and a reddish-brown hue of timber. One of the first places Mahogany wood was discovered was in Belize, however it soon became known that the Mahogany tree was indigenous to the Americas. (Bridgewater, 2012) In its native environment, the Mahogany tree grows to an immense size – as much as 150 feet high and between 10 and 12 feet in diameter.
