The previous set of guidelines, released in 2012, recommended that women ages 21 through 65 get a Pap smear every three years or get both a Pap smear and an HPV test—a practice known as "co-testing"—every five years.

The American Cancer Society today released new screening recommendations for the prevention and early detection of cervical cancer. Screenings are tests for women who have no symptoms of cervical cancer. Among the changes: the American Cancer Society no longer recommends that women get a Pap test every year.

New Screening Guidelines for Cervical Cancer

The 2016 American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) guidelines call for Pap smears for women ages 21 through 29 every three years. For women ages, 30 through 65, ACOG stated that co-testing every five years or a Pap test alone every 3 years is still recommended by most major societies, but HPV testing alone could be considered as an alternative for women age 25 and older.

An ASCUS Pap smear is a Pap smear result in which the patient has a benign level of abnormality in her cervical cells. ASCUS stands for atypical squamous cells of undetermined significance. Having an ASCUS result does not necessarily mean disease is present.
