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Discharge planning is a widespread process - nurses are frequently involved in planning and coordinating discharge. Discharge planning aims to decrease time spent in hospital, improve patient outcomes and reduce costs. The evidence is not clear over whether discharge planning reduces costs or shifts them from secondary to primary care. Further research is needed to determine if discharge planning reduces readmission rates.

What is the effect of discharge planning? | Nursing Times

Examining rates of readmission beyond the industry standard of 30 days revealed the sustained effect of discharge planning for hospitalized patients. It appears essential that psychiatric inpatients have postdischarge outpatient appointments in place to minimize relapse.

Today, there are mainly two different purposes underpinning discharge planning. One is to transfer both care and budgetary responsibility from the hospital to other agencies for patients who are not in need of in-patient care. Another purpose is to plan for patients' continuing health and social care [24].

Barriers to effective discharge planning: a qualitative ...

Discharge planning reduces patient harm, improves safety and facilitates improved patient outcomes. 18 The literature also highlights that the system focus has traditionally been on technical aspects of discharge planning, such as arranging prescriptions and monitoring adherence, rather than on post-discharge coping mechanisms. 18 What stands out to us is the need for more implementation studies that bring together the key stakeholders in an evidence-informed, patient-centered approach.

Poor discharge practice leading to 'unnecessary patient ...

The research demonstrated the direct correlation between good quality discharge planning and a reduction in the rate of hospital readmission. A key aim of effective discharge planning is to reduce hospital length of stay and unplanned readmission to hospital, and to improve the co-ordination of services following hospital discharge.

The Enhanced Discharge Planning Program (EDPP) was designed to augment rather than replace the inpatient hospital discharge planning practice and build on existing practice. The program began as a pilot to address concerns of hospital discharge planning staff that older adults were especially vulnerable to adverse post-discharge outcomes.
