Violent crime in Colombia is analyzed following the demobilization of ex-combatants using municipal-level data. The main findings are that an increased presence of ex-combatants does not systematically increase homicides, but may increase robberies. Reintegration programs are shown to matter. Former paramilitaries who are not in a reintegration program increase crime.

The Reintegration of Ex-Combatants and Post-Conflict---

It shows that each of the three categories of ex-combatants has different responses to security and violence in post-conflict period. It further argues that exploring the interface between various categories of ex-combatants, their re-mobilization vulnerability and the position and interest of re-mobilizing actors can better predict the outcomes of the ex-combatants violence.

Ex-combatants, Security and Post-conflict Violence---

The case of post-conflict Côte d'Ivoire shows that the greatest risk to peace and stability comes from ex-combatants with the closest ties to political power, rather than from those who feel disgruntled and side-lined. It shows that ex-combatants who are closer to political power engage in highly destabilising forms of political engagement, while those farther away, or out of favour, have restricted their actions.

At the root of the specific problems female combatants experience in the post-conflict situation lies the dichotomous belief in ' violent men' and ' peaceful women'. These stereotypes preclude the existence of ' women warriors' and therefore limit both the local and the international thinking on the issue of broader post-conflict reconstruction and reintegration.
