This hierarchy suggests that people are motivated to fulfill basic needs before moving on to other, more advanced needs.

The 5 Levels of Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs

The original hierarchy of needs five-stage model includes: Maslow (1943, 1954) stated that people are motivated to achieve certain needs and that some needs take precedence over others. Our most basic need is for physical survival, and this will be the first thing that motivates our behavior.

Maslow's hierarchy of needs is divided into deficiency needs and growth needs. The first four levels are called deficiency needs or d-needs, while the top level is known as a growth need. Deficiency needs arise due to privation. Some say that they motivate people when they're not met.

Arguably the best known example of such a characteristic is Self-Actualization, an innate motivating force unique to the human species. It was in this landmark publication that Maslow provided the first published representation of Self-Actualization at the pinnacle of a hierarchy of human needs.

Maslow's hierarchy of needs is a motivational model of human development. Motivation is the set of determining elements underlying our behaviour. We feel an urge to act whenever a need arises. It can be aware (hunger, thirst, etc.) or unconscious (instinct, drives).
