Remove the old brackets from the wall, and lay your new radiator on the floor, face down. Slide one of its brackets into position on the back of the radiator, and measure the position of the brackets. Transfer your measurements onto the wall, allowing for a clearance of 100-125mm (4-5") between the bottom of the radiator and the floor.

Open the bleed valve at the top of the radiator and loosen the cap nut using the radiator bleed key or screwdriver. When the tray is almost full, retighten the swivel nut and empty the tray into a bucket. Be ready with cloths to mop up any spillage. Repeat until all the water has drained, then disconnect the other valve.

Place a bowl, tray or bucket under the manual control valve. Grip the valve with an adjustable spanner and hold it steady while you use another to loosen the nut on the valve (the air bleed valve) that is connected to the radiator. Use a radiator key on the top edge of the radiator, to slowly vent any trapped air out of the radiator.

Open the radiator bleed nipple and loosen the connection between the radiator and the valve allowing water to feed into the bowl. Lift your radiator and remove any remaining water from the radiator. Remove the valve connectors and clean them. Wrap the valve connectors with PTFE tape around 17 times.

You should then turn your heating off to avoid scalding yourself and place towels down on the floor underneath the radiator bleed valve, which is usually found at the top of the radiator. Then simply insert the radiator key into the bleed valve and slowly make a quarter to half turn anti-clockwise.

To centralise the radiator, measure between the old valves, divide by two and mark this point on the wall with a vertical line. Find the centre line of the radiator and then measure out from this point to the centre of the bracket supports. Transfer these measurements to the wall. Use a spirit level to get all the lines vertical.
