Analysing the roots of leadership as a non-theme in social work, she suggested that social work students were passionate about direct practice with clients, not with assuming leadership roles. She also put forward ideological constraints, a sense of powerlessness and a general lack of status in society as barriers for social workers to become leaders.

Transformational Leadership in the Social Work Context—

The authoritarian style was first described by psychologist Kurt Lewin in a study that identified three key styles of leadership. People with an authoritarian leadership style make decisions without consulting anyone else on the team. This leadership style can be problematic when overused because it can come off as domineering and tyrannical.
