Aggressive national campaign for federal child labor law reform begins 1916 New federal law sanctions state violators First federal child labor law prohibits movement of goods across state lines if minimum age laws are violated (law in effect only until 1918, when it ' s declared unconstitutional, then revised, passed, and declared unconstitutional again)

Some thoughtful and caring reformers were motivated by the number of children working in such desperate circumstances. They worked to pass federal laws banning child labor.

The one that was the most influential was the NCLC (National Child Labor Committee) They led the fight against big manufacturing businesses and the government as well. The NCLC had an agenda: To change the laws surrounding child labor state by state. But, that wasn ' t effective.

Goals of the Child Labor Movement - Children's Rights

1883 - The New York labor movement, under the leadership of Samuel Gompers, attempts to end child labor in the cigar industry by successfully sponsoring legislation that bans production in tenements, where many of young children work in the trade.
