Art Lesson: Cultural Self-Portraits

Hall: The traditional portrait and self-portrait focuses on the face, with the eyes supposedly being the windows of the soul. A self-portrait is a representation of an artist that is drawn, painted, photographed, or sculpted by that artist. Although self-portraits have been made since the earliest times, it is not until the Early Renaissance in the mid-15th century that artists can be frequently identified depicting themselves as either the main subject, or as important characters in their work.
