The settlements in France followed a series of raids on the French coast mainly from Denmark — although some came from Norway and Sweden as well — and gained political legitimacy when the Viking leader Rollo agreed to swear fealty to King Charles III of West Francia following the Siege of Chartres in 911 AD.
